Troy Bradley's passion for ballooning began in 1976 when his grandparents purchased their first hot air balloon in Denver, Colorado. He soloed at age 14, and went on to earn his private license at 16 , commercial at 18 and gas rating at age 21 . He has logged 6,000 plus hours aloft having spent his lifetime in the air. He has a love for all aspects of the sport from flying, building balloons and keeping the history alive.

Troy's experiences in ballooning cover all aspects of hot air and gas ballooning, including sport flying, competitive flying, instruction, commercial contracts, paid rides, and record-setting, with 58 world records set in hot air, gas, and Rozière balloons.

Troy's desire to share the sport and help it grow is evident in the countless numbers of students he has trained in his own businesses and as Part 141 school flight instructor, as well as in the time he devotes to public service with his volunteerism to the sport. He has served as past president of the Balloon Federation of America, including serving two terms on board of directors as director at large and Gas Division Board. He currently serves as Vice President of Albuquerque Anderson/Abruzzo International Balloon Museum Foundation.

The induction ceremony will be at the United States Ballooning Hall of Fame, located in the National Balloon Museum in Indianola, lowa. It will be the first Sunday during the National Balloon Classic, which is usually the last week of July or first week of August.

## Most Memorable Flights (so far)

Record shattering gas balloon flight from Saga, Japan to off the coast of La Poza Grande, Mexico. Breaking the long standing distance and duration records for straight gas balloons with Leonid Tiukhtyaev. They flew for nearly seven days and had a great circle distance of 6,657 miles.

The 1992 Chrysler Transatlantic Challenge; achieving the first USA to Africa balloon flight and setting an absolute duration record of 6 days for balloons. An absolutely amazing flight!

Giving Walter Cronkite a lesson at Château de Balleroy in 1993.

In 1995, dropping a skydiver (Bob Martin) from 32,000 feet, I then ascended to 34,000 feet.

The 1998 America's Challenge. Landing in the Canadian wilderness and being rescued by helicopter.

The 2001 Gordon Bennett. Crossing the Alps from Germany to Italy with Earl Miller.
2003 Flying out of the Stratobowl at night on the AX9 distance record (the only successful record flight from the Stratobowl since Stephens and Anderson's flight in 1935)

Cluster flight for Disney/Pixar's movie UP. Flying over 4,000 feet MSL sitting on a carbon fiber La- Z-Boy chair with 70 helium balloons. The next flight For National Geographic took the concept further! Jonathan Trappe and Iflew a $1,600 \mathrm{lb}$. house with 3008 balloons to 10,500 feet MSL.

Spending ten months flying over the unique rock formations, stunning valleys, and ancient cliff dwellings of Cappadocia, Turkey.

Crossing the equator by balloon at the Mitad del Mundo (Middle of the World) monument in Ecuador.

Troy's son Bobby's solo. On June 4, 2011, at age 9, he became the youngest trained pilot to solo in a hot air balloon. Troy's daughter Savannah being issued her Student Pilot Certificate and soloing on her 14th birthday. On both occasions he became the proudest flight instructor in history!
