Notable – Accomplishments/Contributions

I was born in Toledo, Ohio in 1944, went to Haskins Elementary School and graduated from Otsego High School in 1962. Received a BS in music education from Manchester College (University), in Indiana, in 1967 and a masters degree in music performance at Bowling Green State University, in Ohio, in 1971. I spent most of my life in Peru, Indiana where I met my wife, Mina, and raised our two children Betsy & Bridget.

I discovered ballooning in 1972 when I came across a book titled "Ballooning" by Peter Dixon. The author made the sport sound relatively safe, and certainly unique, and was a new sport that was open to those who were brave enough to try it. One of the names I found in the book was that of Dennis Floden of Flint, MI. I called him to ask questions about ballooning and he invited my wife & I to Flint where we looked at pictures and talked about balloons for hours. Weeks later I found a guy in Indianapolis by the name of Peter Krieg who owned a couple of balloons and he invited me to Marion, IN to watch him do a promotional flight. I was impressed! Then in the Spring of 1973 I got a phone call from a guy named Don Conner who heard I was interested in balloons. He had just received his commercial balloon license and was eager for me to become his first student. He came up to Peru and made a flight over my town (without me in the basket) but I had already decided I wanted him to train me. So my 46 year adventure started on June 29th 1973 and continued until my retirement in October of 2019.
