

The book's first section briefly covers the role of the flight instrictor and the teaching process. The rest of the manual is a standardized syllabus for flight training for a student pilot, covering 20 mights and the areas of instruction on each flight.

The book also lists sample ourstions in the back — alas, the answers are not given anywhere, which detracts from the usefulness of the quiz. The source material appendix is enrellent.



Overall, the FIM is a publication of which the BFA Education Committee can be proud. Although briefer than one might wish, it helps to fill a serious gap in the existing literature available to balloon pilots today. Cost is \$10 for BFA members, \$15 for non-members.
